As autumn gets underway, it's been another busy few months at Southern Green, with projects progressing on site, new schemes moving through planning and exciting milestones reached.

It's been especially rewarding to see how these landscapes have evolved over time, and how they are now being used and enjoyed by their communities. Fyndoune

Southern Green is delighted to be involved in preparing the landscape design for a new 200-place education facility for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Education, Health and Care needs.

The proposals also include the refurbishment of the existing sports hall and multi-use games area (MUGA), providing additional inclusive facilities for the wider community to use outside of school hours, whilst helping to create a welcoming and accessible setting.

A recent, well-attended consultation event highlighted just how important the project will be to the local community, as well as the value of listening to local views as the design develops. The planning application is due to be submitted next month, marking an important next step for the scheme.



Kynren – The Storied Lands

This summer saw the opening of The Storied Lands, a new themed day park alongside the spectacular Kynren night show.

Southern Green has been involved in the development of the site from the outset, providing landscape and visual impact assessments, landscape masterplanning, detailed landscape design and site inspections. It has been fantastic to see this magnificent scheme evolve over the years into such a unique visitor attraction, with thousands of people enjoying the landscape.

Emmaus Youth Village – Woodland Interpretation

Southern Green has been working on a new woodland interpretation board for Emmaus Youth Village, highlighting the site's landscape, wildlife and community value. The board brings together key facts and bespoke graphics to help visitors discover more about the 8.24-hectare woodland, around 7,500 native broadleaf trees, and a community orchard. It also encourages visitors to explore the woodland and better understand the habitats it supports.



Chapelfield Gardens Bandstand

Southern Green has been supporting Norwich City Council with the restoration of the historic Chapelfield Gardens Bandstand, helping to bring this much-loved feature back into use.

Previously on the Heritage at Risk Register, the restored bandstand now benefits from improved accessible access, new lighting for

events and refreshed surrounding planting, enhancing both its setting and future use.

The restoration has been carefully considered to respect the historic character of the gardens, whilst helping to ensure the bandstand can continue to be enjoyed as part of this important public space for years to come.

We're looking forward to seeing the scheme fully planted and the final details completed over the coming weeks.
